COMMUNITY RELATIONS

CONCEPTS AND ROLES IN COMMUNITY RELATIONS

The Board of Education recognizes that a climate of mutual understanding and cooperation between the schools and staff, students, parents, and community is essential if the education program is to best meet student and community needs and expectations. An effective two-way communications program is vital to active and constructive participation of staff, students, parents, and community in the decision-making process. The Board believes that staff, students, parents, and community are entitled to comprehensive, accurate, and continuing information about school policies, regulations, programs, operations, finances, achievements, goals, problems, needs, and other information about the public schools.

All feasible forms of communications will be used to supply this information.

The Superintendent shall maintain an ongoing and systematic two-way communication program.
